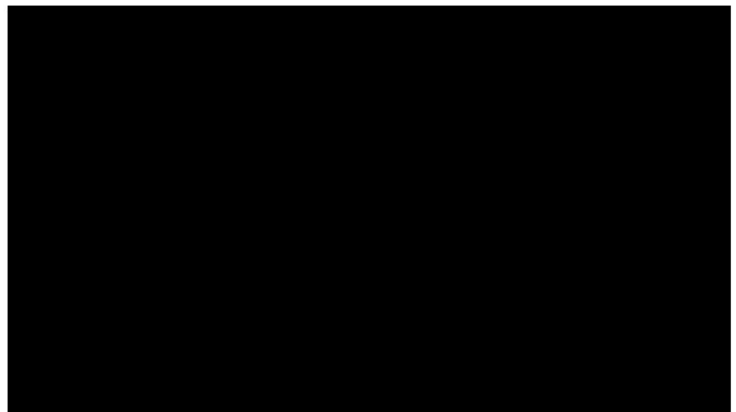


NHVR Round 6 Heavy Vehicle Safety Initiative CoR Training

Executive Summary

The Waste Contractors and Recyclers Association of NSW (WCRA) has been representing its Members in NSW and the ACT for close to 75 years.

The grant provided by the National Heavy Vehicle Regulator (NHVR) has funded face to face Chain of Responsibility (CoR) training to over 192 heavy vehicle drivers, supervisors, schedulers & managers across metropolitan Sydney and regional NSW. The following sessions were delivered-

- 7 x TLIF0009 CoR TAFE certified training workshops.
- 6 x Toolbox Talk CoR sessions.

The result of this funded training is safer drivers, safer vehicles, and safer road use.

A waste & recycling industry heavy vehicle operates in very residential roadway across Australia at least once a week. Having better trained and informed drivers behind the wheel is better protecting Australian families and our future.

All sessions were over subscribed and WCRA would be privileged to work with the NHVR in the future should further funding become available.

Project Stages

Stage 1

- Reviewed and updated Grantees CoR Toolbox Talk material
- Revise the current TLIF0009 training material with TAFE NSW to incorporate the practical compliance elements required by NHVR and WCRA.
- Continuing to meet with TAFE to finalise all training material regarding TLIF0009

Stage 2

- Finalised all training materials regarding TLIF0009 with TAFE NSW.
- Identified and prepared (in hard copy) all relevant course material (in the form of handouts) to be provided to all course participants
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Tuncurry with 15 attendees
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Wetherill Park with 14 attendees (50% from regional NSW)
- Delivered CoR Toolbox session at Lane Cove with 19 attendees

Stage 3

- Promote Workshops & Toolbox sessions at WCRA events such as the Industry Update held at Kirribilli
- Identified and prepared (in hard copy) all relevant course material (in the form of handouts) to be provided to all course participants
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Wetherill Park with 11 attendees
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Smithfield with 16 attendees (40% from regional NSW)
- Delivered CoR Toolbox session at Banksmeadow with 13 attendees
- Delivered CoR Toolbox session at St Mary's with 13 attendees

Stage 4

- Promote Workshops & Toolbox sessions at WCRA events & trade shows such as AWRE at Darling Harbour
- Identified and prepared (in hard copy) all relevant course material (in the form of handouts) to be provided to all course participants
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Camden with 15 attendees
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Wetherill Park with 16 attendees
- Delivered CoR TLIF0009 Workshop at Coffs Harbour with 15 attendees
- Delivered CoR Toolbox session at Tamworth with 19 attendees
- Delivered CoR Toolbox session at Wollongong with 13 attendees
- Delivered CoR Toolbox session at Moree with 13 attendees

What worked well?

- All workshops were very well received and attended
- All attendees took positive CoR messaging back to their respective workplaces
- Updating the workshops from TLIF0002 to TLIF0009 (without funding this would have been a much more difficult process)
- Waste & recycling industry specific CoR case studies included in the training material
- The general feedback from attendees was they benefited greatly from knowledgeable, industry experienced trainers leading the workshop and toolbox sessions

- The 102 attendees of the CoR workshops completed a WCRA evaluation form, see questions & results below and a sample in Appendix 1
- The attendees also completed a TAFE NSW evaluation, see a sample in Appendix 2

Future training improvements

- Provide light refreshments at Toolbox sessions that are conducted at the back end of shifts to maintain interest and knowledge retention
- Source better audio equipment for remote and on-site workshops & toolbox talks

Workplace improvements and statistics including benefits

- Unfortunately, we are not in a position to provide hard statistics on improvements.
- However, 192 workers are now able to better recognise and carefully consider all the potential risks associated with CoR, and to avoid them before they occur
- At the end of one of our workshops a CoR risk was identified in the loading dock, and it was observed that the attendees were ready to implement their CoR learnings
- At most workshops attendees were asked the question, could you better assist in the CoR and safety induction of a new transport worker? The answer was always a very overwhelming yes.

All sessions were oversubscribed and WCRA would be privileged to work with the NHVR in the future should further funding become available.
